Equipping members in apologetics to defend their faith:


- in a world of sinful pressures and temptations

- Provide curriculum for children that is relevant today and prepares them for the future.



Music Curriculum



CURRICULUM 22:6 is a new Early Childhood through High School religion curriculum for WELS school and churches.

CURRICULUM 22:6 is not simply an extension of the current Christ-Light curriculum.

Train up a child in the way he should go; and when he is old he will not depart from it. PROVERBS 22:6

Forward focused to address needs today and into the future:

- Changes in classroom setting and composition
 - An expansion of urban and choice schools
 - An increasingly diverse cultural mix
 - An expanding range of biblical knowledge among students
- Changes in use of technology in the classroom
- Changes in teaching methodology and learning styles
- Changes in the world's view of Christianity

• An extensive survey of pastors, teachers, and parents identified these needs and formed the basis of twelve vision statements for CURRICULUM 22:6.

Twelve Vision Statements – Equipped for Life, Focused on Eternity.

- 1. CURRICULUM 22:6 focuses on the Word of God, allowing him to teach his story.
- 2. CURRICULUM 22:6 focuses on the gospel, with each lesson demonstrating its place in God's plan of salvation.

3. CURRICULUM 22:6 intentionally involves parents in the spiritual training of their children.

4. CURRICULUM 22:6 intentionally focuses on preparing children to recognize the voices that Satan uses to undermine their faith, and on strengthening children to recognize how God's truth reigns supreme.

 CURRICULUM 22:6 nurtures a passion for reaching the lost and prepares students so they can joyfully reach others with the message of Jesus.

 CURRICULUM 22:6 provides resources that enable the teacher to reach all students, no matter what their background or biblical knowledge may be.

7. CURRICULUM 22:6 is a tool that congregations can use to reach families representative of diverse backgrounds, assuring students that all people stand in front of God as equals, sinners who are the focus of God's love in Christ.

8. CURRICULUM 22:6 incorporates the teaching methodology recommended by our worker training schools to most effectively reach students.

9. CURRICULUM 22:6 provides resources that allow teachers to incorporate and use technology as they teach God's Word.

10.CURRICULUM 22:6 incorporates strategies designed to emphasize that the religious education children receive in their Lutheran school is but one step on a path of life-long spiritual growth.

11.CURRICULUM 22:6 incorporates strategies designed to help students recognize the life-changing impact of what they learn, and to encourage the development of skills and attitudes that will help them live their faith.

12.CURRICULUM 22:6 intentionally focuses on outfitting children with the full armor of God, so they will be prepared to courageously defend their faith, and equipped to work as soldiers of the cross of Christ. It regularly encourages children to evaluate their gifts and consider how they can best serve the Lord of the church, whether as future called workers or as lay men and women, working together to advance his gospel.
