### **WORSHIP FOCUS**

Convention worship is planned to reflect themes covered in the convention essay—according to the following plan.

Wednesday	Here We Stand: with joy in all circumstances, even if in apparent defeat
Closing	Here We Stand: offering a bold confession both publicly and privately

### **ORDER OF SERVICE**

The order of service that follows is the liturgical text for the communion service approved by the WELS Hymnal Project. See "A Liturgical Philosophy for *Christian Worship*" for additional information. This article, from the Spring 2021 *Wisconsin Lutheran Quarterly*, is also available at christianworship.com under Resources. The fonts used in this service folder are those used in the new hymnal.

Some hymns, both in the opening service and in later services, are slated for the new hymnal, which will be released this fall. Some hymns used for convention worship are new texts set to familiar tunes. Of course, the new hymnal also will feature many new tunes. But familiar *tunes* allow for a comfortable first experience for all worshipers, not only those who read music or who learn new tunes easily.

While this service includes many new items, it begins with something old (but new to our 1993 hymnal)—a hymn text written by someone who once taught on this campus (Northwestern College), set to music from 1969.



Trusting in him, I pray: God, have mercy on me, a sinner.


Silence for meditation and reflection.










### **GLORY TO GOD IN THE HIGHEST**


### **DISTRIBUTION**
